Main points to remember:

- UBC's English Language Admission Requirement can be met with 6 credits of transferrable English.
- Admission to the Economics major requires a student to have completed at least 54 credits.
- To be admitted, a student must submit a formal application to the School of Economics by the May deadline.
- Selection for admission is based on the average standing in **all credits of post-secondary coursework attempted**, with the **exception of 12 credits** that may be excluded from the calculation.
- Transfer students must first apply for Admission to UBC's Faculty of Arts, and then submit a separate application to the Economics Major. See an advisor for details.
