




ADVANCED SEARCH CONT.

- Scrolling further down in advanced search provides more options to limit results based on full text availability, peer-reviewed results, date, and publication type
- These limiters are also available on the search result page

Selecting limiters will change your results. Full text means a PDF or other document format will be available to download.




NAVIGATING SEARCH RESULTS CONT.



DATABASE TOOLS

If you have a Google account, you can save articles directly to your Google Drive

"Add to Folder" lets you temporarily save the article in the database so you can continue searching. You can e-mail all contents in a folder when you are done at once.





The "Cite" tool can provide a citation in different citation styles

Important: Never copy and paste the citations from a database without checking them against AC's citation style
