Research Activity: Finding Articles

Now is the time to start your research! Go to the [Alexander College Library page](#) and choose a suitable database to search in. Start typing in your keywords, using tools like AND & OR to connect your keywords and synonyms together. Filter your results (e.g. "Peer Reviewed" & "Full Text" & "Publication Date") and locate a scholarly/academic article that seems like it will be useful for your topic. **Find 2 academic articles and provide the relevant citation information below.**

What is the title of the first article you have found?

Who is the author(s)?

An academic journal article or a news/magazine article will come from a journal or periodical publication. You can find this information under the "Source" section on the article information page.

What is the journal that this article comes from?

What is the publication date? You can find this information under the "Source" section on the article information page.

You will need to locate the **volume number** to make your own citation if you plan on using this article in your research. This is usually located under the "Source" section on the article information page after the title of the journal.

You will also need to locate the **journal issue number** to make your own citation if you plan on using this article in your research. This is usually located under the "Source" section on the article information page right after the volume number.

You will also need to locate the **article's starting page number** to make your own citation if you plan on using this article in your research. This is usually located under the "Source" section on the article information page; however, you may also need to open the article itself to find this information.

You will also need to be able to link to the article in your citation. You do not want to use the link from your database web address bar - this link will give anybody using it error messages! Instead, you need to find either the DOI (Digital Object identifier) or permalink. A DOI is a string of letters and numbers that identifies an article on the web. A permalink is a consistent URL that identifies an article in a database.

Provide the Digital Object Identifier (DOI) for your article. If you cannot find the DOI, provide the permalink.
