STEP 2 — Coming Soon at AC

B2 (NCLC 7) — The Express Entry Target

Reach NCLC 7 and unlock:

- ▶ 62 CRS points (bilingual bonus + second-language points)
- ▶ French-language Express Entry draws — cutoffs as low as 397 CRS
- ▶ Provincial Francophone streams (NB, MB and more)

Achieving an NCLC 5 score on the TEF or TCF Canada exam satisfies the language requirement for the **Francophone Mobility Work Permit** — an LMIA-exempt pathway to keep working in Canada outside Quebec when your permit expires.

- ▶ ~40% of all 2025 Express Entry ITAs went to French speakers
- ▶ Canada's Francophone target rising to 12% by 2029 — demand will only grow
