Introducing the English as a Second Language Program

Through regular program assessment and review of student feedback, we observed that our early English language learners needed to develop fundamental language skills prior to the introduction of academic concepts, e.g. essay writing, which are introduced in the EAP program.

We listened to our students, and have completely revamped the lower levels of our EAP program into a contemporary and energized foundational ESL program.

The AC ESL program offers a student-centered and interactive approach to English language acquisition. The program has been designed for beginner to intermediate-level students, and replaces the lower levels (ENGL 095-097) of the English for Academic Purposes program (EAP).

Our Curriculum

The AC ESL curriculum was developed by starting with the fundamental learning outcomes and working backwards, bringing the English language to life through the creation of an interactive learning experience.

The program's goal is to engage students in skill-based active learning that focuses on the most effective ways to evolve their language proficiency.

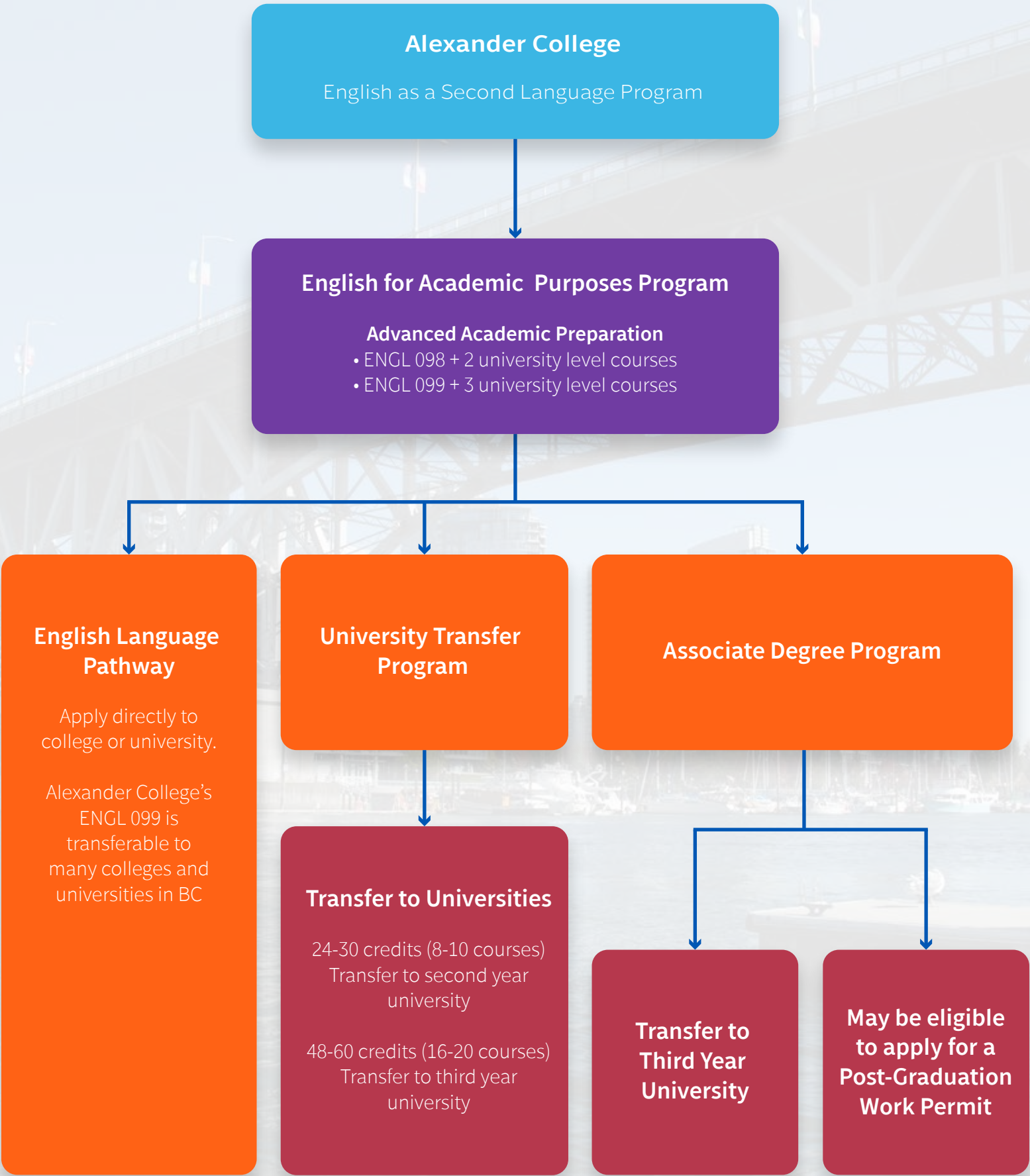


Building Confidence

Vancouver Campus

Writing and Learning Centre

My SSP App

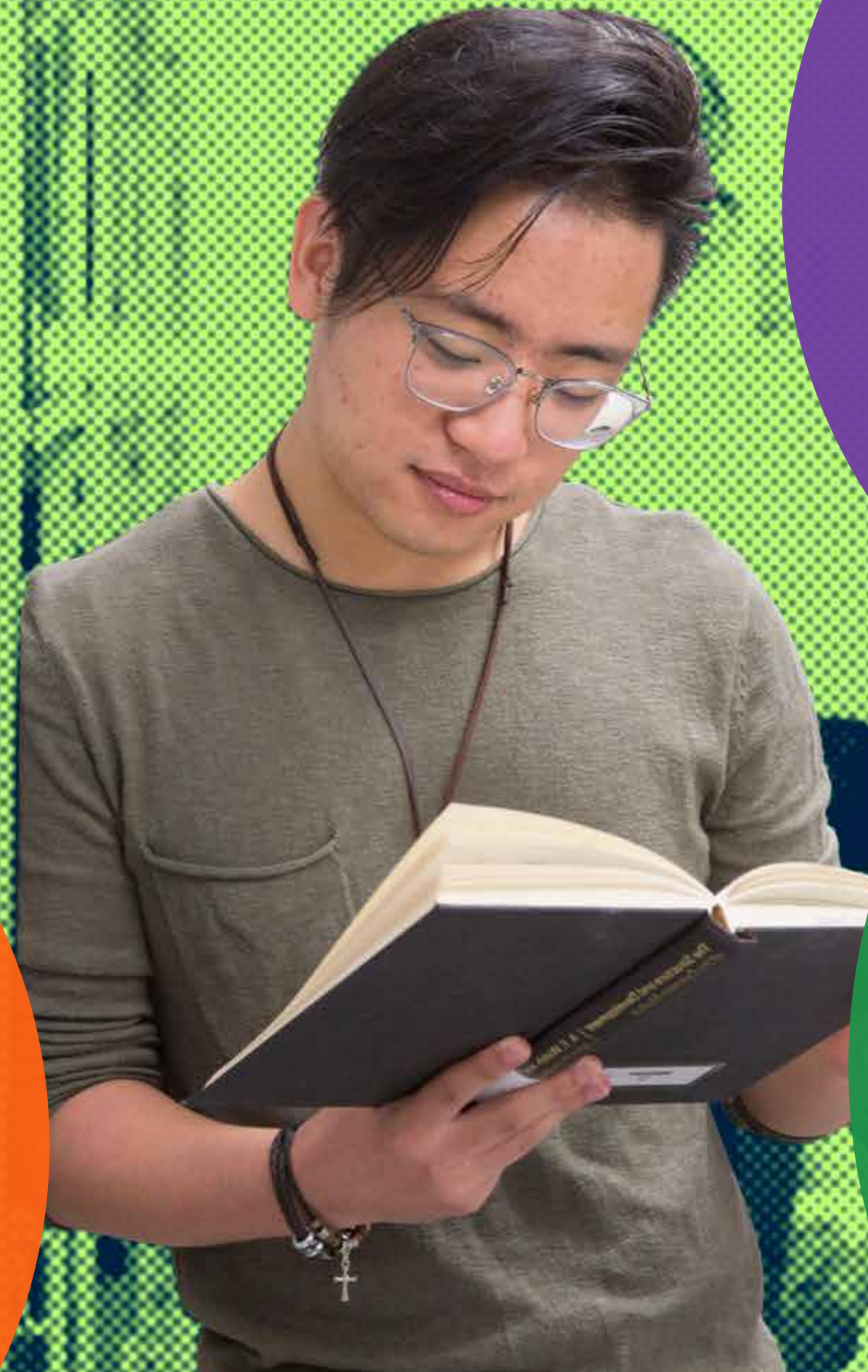
With My SSP, students are able to access free, immediate, and confidential counselling services. Weekly Certification Tutorials

Our ESL programs are based around preparing our AC students for success in Cambridge Proficiency Level Examinations. Each of our levels employ a weekly workshop that allows our students to specifically prepare and focus to write the Cambridge Proficiency Exams.

Our newly developed program revolves around not just English language skill evolution, but specific preparation to excel at Cambridge English Qualifications at these levels.

These include: Young Learners exams and A2 Key for Schools. CEFR Level B1–B2 (independent level). Cambridge English Qualifications at this level include: B1 Preliminary for Schools and B2 First for Schools. CEFR Level C1–C2 (proficient level). Our weekly Certification tutorials are designed to give extra direction to those AC EASL students that wish to pursue official Cambridge Proficiency Exam Certification.



myAC Student Portal and Canvas

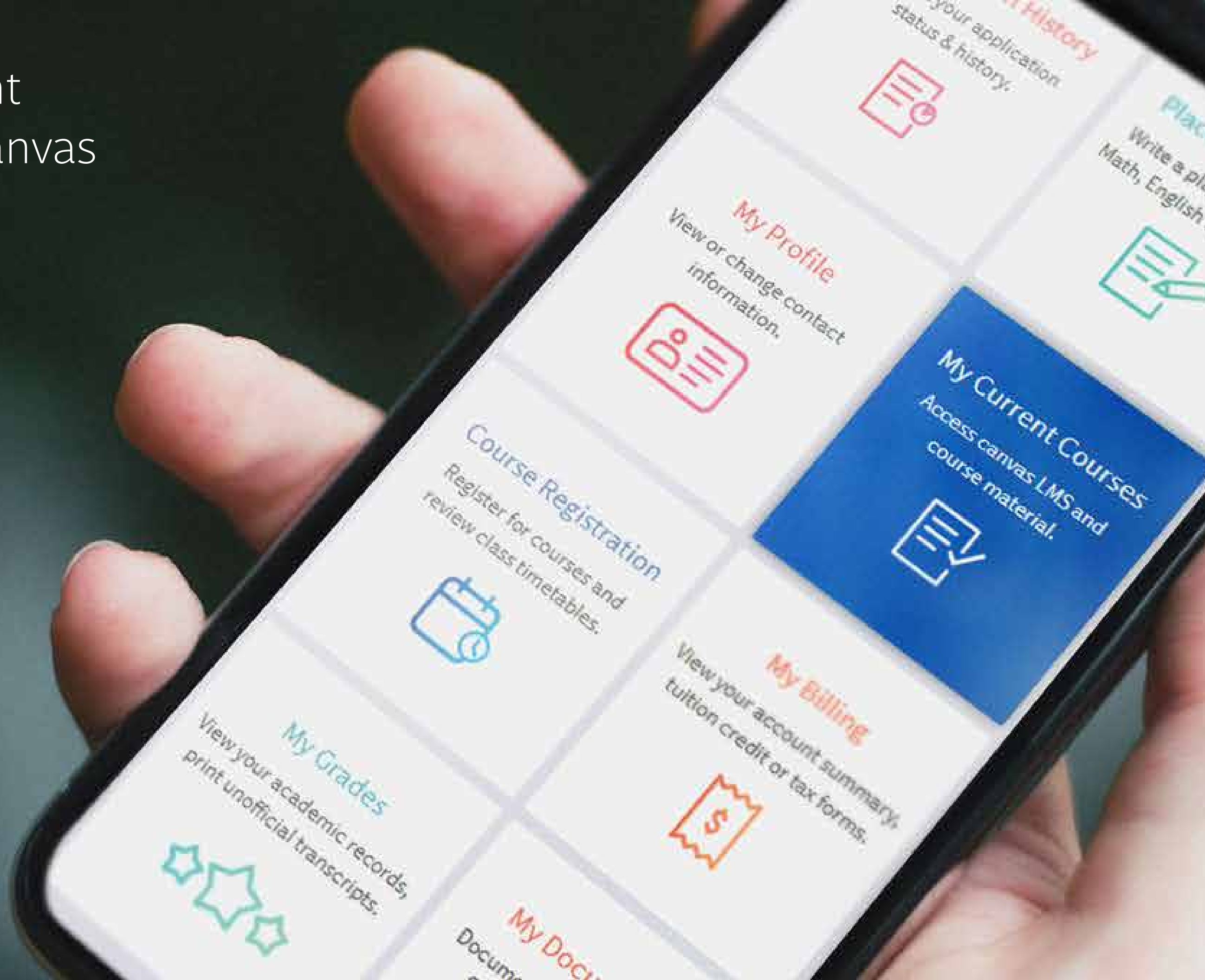
Alexander College students are supported by two internet-based systems, a student information system myAC and a learning management system called Canvas.

myAC Student Portal

ESL Levels and Duration

There are 6 levels of ESL at AC. Each level involves a 7-week program of 20 hours per week of study.



English Foundations I EASL 068

This is the foundational course in the ESL series. At this level, a student may have no prior knowledge of English and will learn the basics, so they are able to communicate simple needs. Students will learn to communicate words and ideas and understand concepts when spoken slowly and clearly. They will also learn to recognize and write letters, numbers, short words, and very short, simple phrases related to everyday situations.

English Foundations II EASL 069

At this level, students continue to build foundational skills and are learning to master the basics of English, so they can interact with others in a simple way. Students will learn how to use familiar everyday expressions, how to ask and answer questions about personal details, and how to write personal information. Students are beginning to guess the meaning of unknown words in texts and use visual clues. They are developing an understanding of simple language structures, everyday vocabulary, and can use these to construct simple sentences about personal experiences.

Beginner I EASL 078

At this level, students are introduced to the language and skills needed to communicate and understand basic information about common everyday activities, experiences, wants and needs in small group settings. Students learn to identify the purpose, main ideas, and some specific details in texts, and also to write multi-sentence compositions with a developing understanding of spelling, punctuation, and capitalization.

Beginner II EASL 079

At this level, students are introduced to frequently used expressions related to their personal areas of interest, and are able to communicate in conversations and in simple forms of written communication. Students can understand key words, phrases and the overall meaning of short texts related to familiar topics. Students learn to use more complex grammatical structures, mechanics, and topic-specific vocabulary.

Intermediate I EASL 088

At this level, students learn to maintain small group discussions and build their fluency, developing strategies for responding to moderately complex communication styles and settings. Students also learn to describe experiences and events, dreams, hopes, and ambitions and briefly give reasons and explanations for opinions and plans with clear pronunciation. Finally, students learn to identify the purpose, main ideas, important details, links between paragraphs, and styles in texts. The course builds on vocabulary and grammatical structures, so students are able to produce simple connected paragraphs on topics which are familiar or of personal interest.

Intermediate II EASL 089

At this level, students learn to extract the main ideas from texts, and to engage in more complex discussions about their areas of interest. The course covers a range of vocabulary, which includes idioms and colloquial expressions. Students build fluency and spontaneity through regular interaction with other speakers. They produce clear, detailed writing on a wide range of subjects and learn to express their point of view by writing about a topical issue, citing the advantages and disadvantages of various options with proper mechanics.



English for Academic Purposes Program – EAP

The English for Academic Purposes Program (EAP) is a preparatory program designed to develop core English language skills within a post-secondary context. The courses are designed to develop students' academic study and participation skills, while improving their English skills to a level that will lead to success in university courses.

EAP Levels and Duration

The EAP program consists of two levels, ENGL 098 and ENGL 099, each focusing on language learning through academic subjects such as Film Studies, History, Literature, Philosophy, Science, and Sociology. Each EAP level has a duration of 14 weeks, comprised of 10-15 hours of study per week.

University Pathway

Students who intend to pursue post-secondary studies in Canada may also begin to enrol for college/university-level courses while enrolled in the EAP program.

ENGL 098 + up to 2 college/university-level courses

ENGL 099 + up to 3 college/university-level courses



University Transfer Program

In the University Transfer Program, students are able to explore their academic interests through first and second-year courses which may be transferred to colleges/universities for admission to the second or third year of a Bachelor's Degree program.

Associate Degree Programs

The Associate Degree program is a foundational degree consisting of 60-64 credits, typically completed over a 2-year period. The program provides a comprehensive learning experience that also allows students to customize and focus their coursework in an area of personal interest.

Options After Graduation

On completion of an Associate Degree program, students may choose to either enter the workforce or continue their studies in pursuit of a Bachelor's Degree.

Post Graduation Work Permit

International students completing an Associate Degree program may be eligible to apply for a Post-Graduation Work Permit (visit www.cic.gc.ca for details).

The program provides a comprehensive learning experience that also allows students to customize their coursework in order to focus on an area of personal interest.

Associate of Science Degree

Students within the Associate of Science Degree program will gain multi-disciplinary knowledge of natural and applied sciences, and develop their critical thinking and research skills. The program provides a comprehensive learning experience that also allows students to customize and focus their coursework in an area of personal interest such as biology, chemistry, computer science, mathematics, or physics.



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
