"In writing, a **transition** is a word or phrase that connects one idea to another. This connection can occur within a paragraph or between paragraphs. Transitions are used to show how sentences or paragraphs are related to each other and how they relate to the overall theme of the paper."


Why are transitions important?

Transitions

- help the flow of a piece of writing
- help establish the connection between sentences and paragraphs
- improve readability and clarity

Let's look at some sample phrases with transition words to show you how we can use transitions in our writing!

Addition

Definition

 When we want to add information or a point to our existing points

Examples

 Again, as a result, besides, similarly, likewise, as well as...

Sample Phrase

• Jogging is fun. **Also**, it is good for your health.



Consequence

Definition

 When we want to show a cause-and-effect relationship or correlation

Examples

 Accordingly, as a result, because, consequently, due to this, therefore, hence...

Sample Phrase

• It was a hot day **so** my ice cream melted.

Definition

 When we want to state a different or contrasting idea.

Contrast

Examples

 However, on the contrary, nevertheless, or, yet, conversely...

Sample Phrase

 I love going to the beach, but I can't swim.

Emphasis

Definition

 When we want to highlight a key point

Examples

 Above all, indeed, of course, surely, truly, in fact...

Sample Phrase The lecture was boring, especially because it was 3 hours long.

Exception

Definition

 When we want to highlight an inconsistency or anomaly

Examples

 Aside from, besides, except for, exclusive of, other than...

Sample Phrase He was perfect, with the exception of his taste in shoes.



Details and Examples

Definition

 When we want to illustrate a point with an anecdote

Examples

 Including, to explain, namely, in detail, for instance, specifically, such as...

Sample Phrase Vancouver is a rainy city. For example, it poured for the entire month of February.



Sequence

Definition

 When we want to identify a time order

Examples

 Firstly, after, then, at last, previously, next, eventually...

Sample Phrase First, apply a base coat. Second, allow to dry.

Summary

Definition

 When we want to restate our main points or conclude

Examples

 In conclusion, to summarize, in short, consequently, finally, accordingly...

Sample Phrase • In summary, I have provided a list of reasons why I hate tomatoes.
